

From the Incumbent's Desk

The Arrival of Advent

Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour. Matthew 24:44

We are about to start another year on our church calendar. It begins on the first day of Advent – Sunday, December 1st. It's a very exciting time of year as most people – young and old – are looking ahead to the celebration of Christmas.





Each Sunday's gospel story that we will hear through Advent is from the Gospel of Matthew. Matthew reminds us that, even as we await the day we mark as Jesus' birth in Bethlehem, we are truly awaiting the day when Jesus comes for the second time, when God's kingdom will at last be fully here "on earth as it is in heaven."

Matthew tells us that we must be ready for when Jesus comes

again. How do you get ready for a day like that? Well, we also hear from the apostle Paul through Advent and he tells us what to do: "Live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God" (Romans 15:5-7). For Paul, the bottom line is love – love God and love your neighbour – as we all live into the time of the complete fulfillment of God's purpose that *every* person and *all* creation be in right relationship with each other and with God.

The season of Advent is a time of expectation, of anticipation, and of waiting but most of all, of hope. Christians have the *certain* hope that God *will* keep his promises and God's kingdom *will* be completely revealed here on earth. That hope can fade into the background in a world where it feels like, sometimes, there is more bad than good. But, in Advent, our hope is front and centre. So...we love. We love God and we love each other. We love so that God's love fills us and pushes out everything else. As we await the coming of the light of the world – Jesus Christ – we allow the light of Christ to shine into the world through our love. I invite you into Advent and beyond with the words of the prophet Isaiah:

"Come let us walk in the light of the Lord!" Isaiah 2:5

More "Reaching Out" ...


We are working towards the fulfillment of God's purpose by reaching out in love to seniors (and anyone else who wants to join us) in Echo Bay and on the Island:

The following article was in last year's Advent newsletter but it's important, so here it is again to help you celebrate Advent in your home:



Did you know?

The Advent wreath marks the passage of the weeks of the season of Advent. It was originally devised to encourage family observance of Advent and was introduced to congregational worship only to provide a model for family use.

If you'd like to have an Advent Wreath at home, hit a dollar store for what you need (that's what I did): plate; four candles (all blue, or all purple, or 1 pink candle for Advent 3); 4 candle holders; some fake greenery to decorate (if you want to).

Advent 1 – The week of Dec.1st...Light one purple candle each night at supper and have someone read this prayer:

Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and put on the armour of light, now in the time of this mortal life in which your Son Jesus Christ came to us in great humility, that on the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty we may rise to the life immortal; through him who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**.

Advent 2 – The week of Dec.8th ...Light two purple candles each night at supper and have someone read this prayer:

Almighty God, who sent your servant John the Baptist to prepare your people to welcome the Messiah, inspire us, the ministers and stewards of your truth, to turn our disobedient hearts to you, that when the Christ shall come again to be our judge, we may stand with confidence before his glory; who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, on God, now and for ever. **Amen**.

Advent 3 – The week of Dec.15th...Light three purple candles (or 2 purple, 1 pink) each night at supper and have someone read this prayer:

God of power and mercy, you call us once again to celebrate the coming of your Son. Remove those things which hinder love of you, that when he comes, he may find us waiting in awe and wonder for him who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**.

Advent 4 – Dec.22nd, 23rd & 24th...Light all 4 purple candles (or 3 purple, 1pink) both nights at supper and have someone read this prayer:

Heavenly Father, who chose the Virgin Mary, full of grace, to be the mother of our Lord and Saviour, now fill us with your grace, that we in all things may embrace your will and with her rejoice in your salvation; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**.
